Benefit changes

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- Day-to-day benefit for non-contracted GPs limited to two consultations per beneficiary per year
- **Mental health limit increased** from R9 100 to R9 400: 3.3% increase
- **In-hospital specialised radiology benefit increased** from R14 000 pb, R28 300 pf to R14 470 pb to R29 200 pf
- **In-hospital consultations** with GP and specialists: combined limit increased to R2 400 pb
- **NEW day clinic network introduced.** Co-payment* applies for non-use.
- No change to reimbursement rates in-hospital
- Chronic disease benefit unchanged
- Maternity benefits remain unchanged
- No change to oncology, organ transplant and renal dialysis, as well as internal and external prosthesis benefits
- **Medication for HIV/AIDS:** Members must obtain medication from Pharmacy Direct from 2021, otherwise they'll pay a 40% co-payment
- No increase on in-hospital limits
- **Co-payments*:**
 - **NEW:** Voluntary non-use of contracted provider for non-PMB cataract surgery
 - **NEW:** Use of non-network day clinic R2 000
 - Co-payment for elective caesarean increased from R12 000 to R12 500
 - Trauma treatment for non-PMBs in a casualty ward: increased from R600 to R630
 - Increase in all procedure co-payments
 - Co-payment for use of non-network hospitals has increased from R12 000 to R12 500
- Oncology: Must use Scriptpharm as a DSP or pay a 25% co-payment. Members who are registered on the Fedhealth Oncology Disease Management Programme, will receive a communication explaining what this will mean for them and what they will need to do gery
